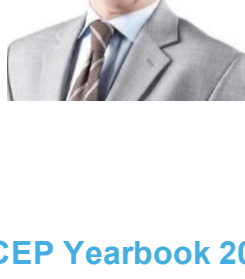

Executive update

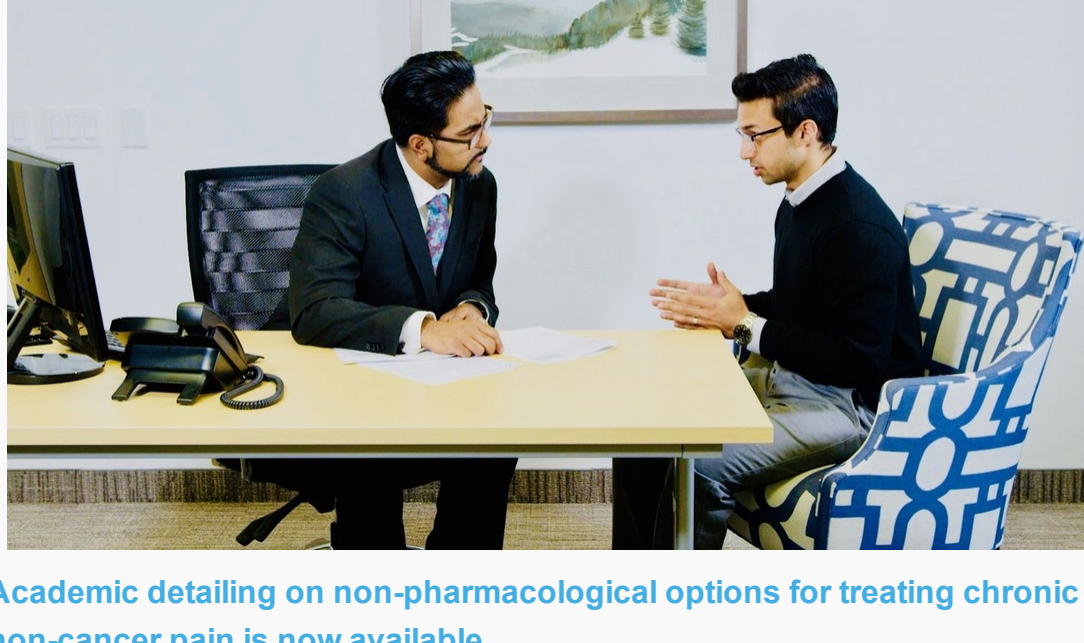

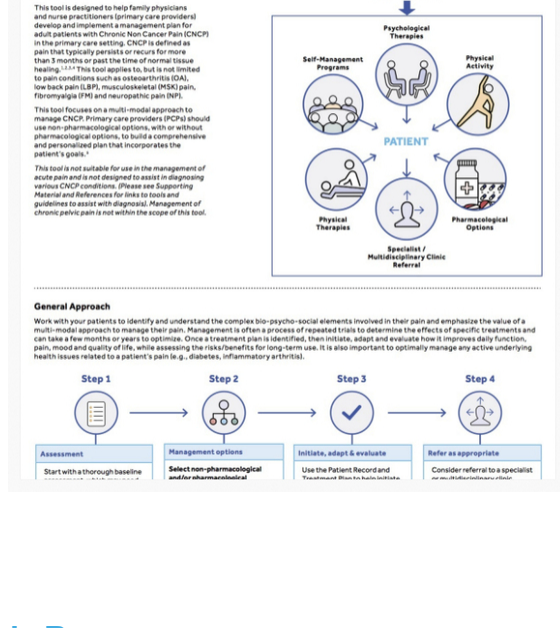
Academic detailing on non-pharmacological options for treating chronic non-cancer pain is now available

We regularly conduct online focus groups and usability sessions. Through the sessions, providers call in and give their thoughts on the projects and topics we're working on. [Sign up.](#)

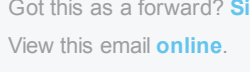
iDynaform pilot study
